Sunny Exposure

• 6-8 hours or more of Direct Sun • Usually a direct east, south, or west exposure

Plants to Grow on a Shady Balcony

Shady Exposure

• 4 hours or less of Direct Sun • Usually a northeast, north, or northwest exposure

Begonia, Mixed Begonia, Solenia Begonia, Bossa Nova Begonia, Fuchsia, Sunpatiens

- Abutilon
- Begonias Solenia, Dragon Wing,
 Bossa Nova (trailing), Nonstop upright, Rex

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Plants to Grow on a Shady Balcony

Herbs & Vegetables:

- Herbs of any kind will grow on a balcony
- Patio peas, beets, carrots, cucumbers, kale, peppers, tomatoes
- Mixed lettuce bowls

• Most vegetables need at least 6 hours of direct sunshine; you could experiment & see what will grow.
